

Big Lagoon Messabout May 10-11, 2008



Please join us May 10-11 for a small-boat messabout on the beautiful waters of Big Lagoon. The Humboldt Lagoons State Park is just above Trinidad, about 30 minutes north of Eureka.

Attendance is confirmed from members of the Sacramento-San Francisco and Lost Coast chapters of the Traditional Small Craft Association, plus Humboldt County locals and even some of the Coos group from Oregon. All types of boats are welcome at this messabout; traditional or modern, wooden or fiberglass, power, sail or oar.

Messabout boats can be pulled up on the clay beach on the north shore of the Big Lagoon County Park campground, or anchored out from the beach overnight. The launch ramp is a short drive from the campground, and the long sandbar between lagoon and ocean offers wonderful views, hiking and picnic areas.

The main camp is at the Big Lagoon County Park, where we will stake out a few of the campsites along the shore. Since no reservations or dogs are allowed, not everyone may be able to stay at Big Lagoon Campground. Patrick's Point State Park takes reservations and dogs, and other tent, cabin and RV campgrounds are nearby.

The Big Lagoon Messabout is organized by David "Thorne" Luckhardt, active in both Northern California TSCA groups as well as with Morgan's Companie in Eureka.
